#### At a glance...

- Overall the general rate and utility charges will increase by 5%
- A 15% discount for early payment will continue to be offered when you pay in full on or before 30 August 2013
- A 10% discount will apply should you pay by the instalment option with the first payment due on or before 30 September 2013
- A Pensioner concession of up to \$200 will apply to eligible ratepayers

Our operational expenditure is \$56.2 Million and capital expenditure is \$42.3 Million.

Our operating revenue is \$53.2 Million with 52.41% coming from operating subsidies and grants.

- \$1.7 Million Maintenance on shire roads
- \$627,000 Reseal and gravel re-sheeting programs
- \$90,000 Kerb and channel rehabilitation
- \$56.12 Million Funded restoration program under NDRRA
- \$120,000 Helens Hill Road improvement
- \$150,000 Pomona Road improvement.




