Total Expenditure \$37.8 Million

Mayor's Message

The 2017/2018 Budget reflects the Hinchinbrook Shire Council's commitment to reigning in costs and delivering appropriate services to the community. Actions Council has taken include:

- General Rates will increase by 1.5%
- Extension in level of employment offered to Apprentices and Trainees
- Council has budgeted a Capital Works Program of \$14.5 million and remains committed to using local businesses and contractors to undertake this. Council is determined to help stimulate the local economy.
- Council will continue to remain debt free
- Council remains committed to fostering business growth and diversification: \$188,000 is budgeted for Economic Development activities
- Continued focus on maintaining costs – reduction in Overall Operating Costs of over \$287,000 compared to the 2016/2017 Budget






Where the Money Comes From \$34.34 Million

Virtual Vouchers

The virtual waste vouchers program will continue in 2017/2018 with vouchers to be used at both the Halifax and Warrens Hill Waste facilities.

Each residential property within the Shire has four free virtual waste vouchers available to them. These can be accessed by presenting proof of address when visiting a Waste Facility or Transfer Station in the Shire.

Pensioner Discount



A pensioner concession granted by Council is 20% to a maximum of \$200 and State Government Pensioner Subsidy also grant 20% to a maximum of \$200. Concessions will apply to eligible ratepayers and will be applied equally to both rate notices.
