#### **Description of Land**

- 2062 Abergowrie Road, Long Pocket
- Lot 41 on SP204134

#### Structures on the land

- Fully operational tennis courts;
- Non-operational lights around the tennis courts;
- Toilet facilities (containing asbestos and are no longer in working order-require demolition);
- · Storage Facility.

## **Duty of Care**

- a) Lessees must use the land only for the purpose for which the Tenure was issued;
- b) Lessees have the responsibility for duty of care for the land under the Land Act 1994;
- c) Lessees are responsible for pest management on the property;
- d) Lessees must remove the improvements within a period of three months from the date of termination of the Lease;
- e) Lessees must not affect any structural or further structural or excavation improvements on the land without authority first being obtained from relevant State and local authorities;
- f) Lessees must ensure that the development and use of the land meets the local authority i.e (Planning Scheme/Local Laws); and
- g) Lessees will be required to allow members of the community to continue with their regular usage of the tennis courts.
