



## From the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers

Yesterday, I was indeed privileged to witness the Episcopal Ordination of Bishop-elect Tim Harris – the first in Townsville in almost 50 years. It was a wonderful celebration to welcome our new shepherd to the Diocese.

Bishop Harris received his secondary education at one of our brother schools, St Joseph's Nudgee College, Brisbane, and I look forward to welcoming him at Ignatius Park College. The College had a wonderful relationship with the late Bishop Michael Putney, including the naming of the Putney House, and I am sure the staff and students of Ignatius Park look forward to establishing a long lasting friendship with our new Bishop. Indeed, after a three year wait for our new Bishop, there are many challenges facing our Church at the moment, both local and globally. I did take from today's ordination a wonderful sense of hope and the power of faith.

Today's ceremony also reminded me of a story I read years ago.

*Admiral Jim Stockdale, the highest ranking US military officer imprisoned during the Vietnam War, survived eight years of torture while many others died around him. "I never lost faith in the end of the story. I never doubted I would get out," he later wrote. His experience gave rise to what later became known as the Stockdale Paradox. In essence it says: "Retain faith that you will prevail in the end, regardless of the difficulties and at the same time confront the most brutal facts of your current reality whatever they might be."*

*There are certainly many who would like to process such uncompromising hope as they battle to confront any one of the various crises that have overtaken their lives, e.g. personal loss or failure, global economic insecurity or failed relationships.*

*A prominent Egyptian businessman, quoted in a recent weekend newspaper, maintained the need to look at what is happening around us and respond in new ways. He wrote: "The worst of times? No. These are the best of times, an opportunity for unprecedented creativity."*

*What both Stockdale and the businessman have in common is a bold attitude which seeks to embrace the profound difficulties that are experienced with a focused and creative vision that will lead to not only rebuilding and reclaiming one's life, but will also generate significant improvement to the way things are.*


*In effect, this is also the business of schools. For students, the 'now' in schools can be a constant struggle to unravel a future that only becomes clear through the journey of growth, maturity, study and experience. In a microcosm of any classroom on any given day, students are challenged to respond creatively to the world around them; the mathematical world, the world of language, literature and the arts, the social world in all its diversity. Consciously or subconsciously, they continue to measure themselves against the other; they compare, assess and reassess their gifts, their shortcomings and their future vision for themselves. What they find and how they deal with it will form signposts of their life.*

*Our task as parents and teachers is to lead them to see the opportunities that can emerge from the haze of disappointment and to help them understand that brokenness and what they might see as failure can initiate a desire to restore, to piece things together again, to recreate the will to achieve and the knowledge that they can achieve – often to the highest levels.*

*And, like Stockdale, it will be possible for them to develop a strong belief in themselves that says to the world: "I will succeed; I will never lose sight of the end of the story because the end of the story is who I am."*

For every student at Ignatius Park, this is the core of our vocation to our young people and the essence of our prayer for them.

When the van was finished in Proserpine (they came to help after the cyclone), they took the opportunity to keep coming to Townsville and raise awareness/thank some people who were already fundraising. ## 2017 Student Residential Address Collection

This notice is from the Australian Government Department of Education and Training (the department), to advise you that the department has requested your child's school provide a *statement of addresses*, in accordance with section 21 of the *Australian Education Regulation 2013* (the Regulation).

A *statement of addresses* contains the following three pieces of information about students at the school:

- Students' residential address (**not student names or other identifying information**)
- Students' level of education (i.e. whether the student is receiving primary or secondary education)
- Students' boarding school status (boarders or day students)

### Authority for and Purpose of Collection

Consistent with previous practice, and following the *2016 Australian Bureau of Statistics National Census of Population and Housing (Census)*, it is timely that information held by the department is updated in order to ensure that Australian Government funding calculations for your child's school are accurate.

Under section 21 of the Regulation, a *statement of addresses* **must not explicitly identify an individual student**. Accordingly, all information in the *statement of addresses* provided by your child's school to the department is de-identified.

### Use and Disclosure of Information

It is important to ensure the *statements of addresses* are accurate, and the department may from time to time carry out audits of *statements of addresses* to verify their accuracy. In the event of an audit, the department's contracted auditors may seek to compare a school's *statement of addresses* with student enrolment information held by the school for the purpose of verifying the information. The department's contractors will not use the information for any other purpose.

Any further use and disclosure of information relating to the *statement of addresses* will occur in accordance with section 65 of the Regulation.

Please find below tips for your son on how to be successful at a job interview. Steps 1,2,3 and 4 were covered in previous Newsletters, here is Step 5.

### Step 5: AFTER the Interview

Write and send a thank you letter to your interviewer and anyone else you spoke with during your interview. Type your thank you letter on a computer. Be sure to check your spelling of all names and titles. Thank the interviewer for the time he or she took to interview you, re-emphasize your skills, talents, and abilities, and include anything you may have forgotten to add during the interview or in your résumé that might help get you the job.

### What to do after the interview:

- Send a thank you letter.
- If you take the job, do not be shy about negotiating a salary.
- If you did not get the job, get feedback on why you did not get the position and stay positive.
- Reflect on what went well and what did not go well to improve for the next interview.


