- JCUSA Sport have expressed an interest in competing in UniSport Nationals Rugby League 9's. Because of budget and staff workloads it's looking like only a Men's team will be sent, but quality coaches have yet to be found.
- Women's 7's was fantastic, and a great way to strengthen the side ahead of UniSport Nationals. I am of the
 opinion that this is how we should train all our JCU representative sides ahead of Nationals. We should explore
 any avenues available to pursue this with the university since it directly reflects on the quality of our sporting
 programs.
- Lunch activities program is in the planning stages, Ultimate Frisbee, Robotics Club and Townsville Table Tennis
 are keen
- A cricket 6's tournament is scheduled for 14th September in conjunction with SASA and hopefully Saints
- Interfaculty sport is running well on game days this year, but some faculties still struggle with finding enough participants. Perhaps we need to find another way to promote it or raise the prestige of the competition. The biggest problem I've found is that a large number of students simply don't know that it's on.
