This is a subject that many students come to JCU specifically to take, when they could well have studied at a higher prestige institution. From my understanding this subject was cut because of budgetary concerns, which is an absolute slap in the face to students.

I believe memberships are up on this time last year, and considering the reduction in student numbers this is a very good result.

- I have been planning an IDAHOBIT (International Day Against Homophobia, Biphobia, Intersexism and Transphobia). The planned date is 14-05-2020. The main day for IDAHOBIT is 17-05-2020 however that is a Sunday so we are planning this event on a Thursday. I discussed this with involving our Townsville advocates and other local organizations. The main plan is to have free themed food, activities and an inclusive health workshop in the day and host a drag show party at the Uni Bar that night.
- I believe we could get involved with JCU Sustainability about being more sustainable especially for our events and in our office. In Townsville, our office only has a normal waste and recycling bin, therefore I believe introducing a compost bin would be a good addition. JCU Sustainability are aiming to commence providing compost bins to offices soon as they previously had a large issue with contamination. Also, with the events JCUSA is involved in, such as Free Breakfasts it would be a good idea to organizing a compost bin for those considering the likelihood of leftover food that currently ends up in landfill.
- I have also been having discussion regarding a section on the JCUSA website as I believe is due to be updated. Particularly around the information of sexual harassment and sexual assault as there is currently on advice or links to the JCU Respect page on our website. Also from my meeting with Ryl, she suggested adding a section "If Your Unhappy With JCU's Response". I plan on talking to her further about the exact language and information to add in this.
