issue:

Current language of the JCUSA Constitution is not inclusive to the entire JCU student community and therefore, should be amended to reflect the diversity of our student cohort. Changing the pronouns will be inclusive to all students as it is applicable to all people, not gender specific.

Background Information:

In the current state of the Constitution, when referring to office bearers it uses the pronouns 'his' or 'her', therefore I propose that these be amended to 'their' when talking about their position. I believe this an additional step that the JCU Student Association to continue becoming more inclusive, respectful; and overall benefit gender-diverse equality on campus as the student leaders we are
