Consistent with gospel values and our Mission Statement, we follow the example of Jesus in respecting the dignity of each child, young person and vulnerable adult.



Advent is an attitude of anticipation. The entire season prepares us to allow Christ into our hearts, sometimes in ways far different from other times when we celebrate the "excitement of December." Many people want everything about this season to stay the same year after year: the same carols, the same schedule for giving gifts, even food prepared in the same way. Fine. Consistency does give consolation to the heart.

But another truth tells us that each year ought to be different. We are not the same. We are faced with different responsibilities, moved by different insights, changed (or charged) by circumstances we didn't have before, challenged by fresh opportunities and different memories, equipped with increasing or diminishing capacities for coping with all these variations. So we never "Advent" in exactly the same way.



Christ is preparing to come to us this Christmas in a way that suits who we are—and how we are—this year. On the Sundays in Advent (from the gospels in this year's readings), our Lord speaks to us with words meant to sustain us for the coming week.

The first half of these reflections traces Jesus' coming at different times to different people. We can relate to these people, some more than others; we could call them our "instructing personalities." There is an "Adventing" unique to each of them. And each has a message to share with us about preparing for Christmas. They all offer us prayers we can pray that will help us get ready in ways that should be right for us.

The eight days before Christmas celebrate the people close to that first Christmas. By reflecting on how Christ's love came to them, we can embody their graciousness and ask their help as we live our Advent. It is important, of course, to be gracious as we welcome Jesus who never changes. For twenty centuries, as God-infant and God-man, he has never varied in the genuineness and hopefulness of his offer of love. The message of his Christmas story is constant and always with us. Of this much we are sure.



But it is also important that Jesus learn to be sure of us. We must let him recognize us when he comes this year. We must let him know who we really are and what our inmost hopes are. We need to learn again the humility of the Child of Bethlehem. And we need his Mother to teach us how to love ... and how to be able to be loved back.

Celebrating O'Loughlin Day Mass

On the 14th of November we celebrate Bishop John Patrick O'Loughlin MSC. He became the Bishop of Darwin on the 13th of January, 1949, and over the next thirty-six years, helped to build up the Catholic school system in the NT.

At the time of his death on 14 November, 1985, one of Bishop O'Loughlin's dreams was for a second Catholic High School in Darwin to be situated in the Northern Suburbs - O'Loughlin Catholic College came into being in 1987.

He loved all people, from all walks of life and faith backgrounds. He was a man of dedication and humility, even helping to build St Mary's Cathedral we are now in today.

O'Loughlin Catholic College takes great pride in bearing his name.

Bishop John O'Loughlin was always a scholar. He loved learning and appreciated the fact that it is through education that one's life can improve. As a young priest he taught in Catholic schools and became a Director of Catholic Education in PNG, before becoming Bishop of the Diocese of Darwin.

As the Bishop he worked tirelessly to ensure that good Catholic education was widely available throughout the Territory.

He was a visionary – and this was obvious by the fact that he built health facilities, schools, churches, and even a Cathedral for the people of the NT – especially after they had suffered two catastrophes, World War II and Cyclone Tracy.

His motto as a Bishop was 'To draw with bonds of love', and there was no doubt that love was at the heart of all he did. He was a priest who was a member of the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart, who at the centre of their lives, try to be the heart of Christ on earth.

Each year, at our O'Loughlin Day Mass "The Bishop O'Loughlin Award" award is given to a student or staff member who like Bishop O'Loughlin is:

Guided by Jesus

Has a curiosity for and love of learning

Is a person of vision, a creative thinker who looks to serve others

Is actively involved in the O'Loughlin Community.

The awards this year were presented by Fr John Kelliher who is a fellow MSC priest who first came to serve in the Northern Territory in 1975, lived and worked with Bishop O'Loughlin during this time and is currently the parish priest of St Paul's in Nightcliff.

Our first Bishop O'Loughlin Award winner was Kevin Valerio. He is a student who positively impacts our community through his interactions with staff and students. Kevin is bold and proud to love Jesus and lives his life trying to follow Him. He is kind to all and is constantly trying to learn from others and achieve excellence in all he does. Kevin is humble and passionate and always willing to share his gifts and talents in the service of God and others.






Promoting active engagement, we encourage students and staff to visit the College library to view these posters and initiate meaningful and important conversations.


Speaking of exciting events ... O'Loughlin Musical is coming back in 2024!!


