



## Secondary Domestic School Fee Schedule 2026

Please find enclosed the school fees for 2026 as approved by the school board in consultation with the finance committee. The payment of fees is a responsibility and commitment accepted by the Parents/Guardians and ensures the college maintains quality education and resources for the benefit of all students.

### Application Fee

A non-refundable fee of \$160 (Incl GST) is payable by Parents/Guardians of each new student enrolment. This is payable when lodging the application of enrolment.

### Acceptance Fee

When enrolments are accepted a refundable deposit of \$500 per student is payable (This fee is credited towards your child's fees in the year they start).

### ICT Levy

A compulsory ICT Levy of \$495 per annum applies to all newly enrolled students. The levy covers the cost of a college-provided laptop allocated to each student. Payment of the annual levy in full is required at the commencement of each school year and must be received before the laptop is issued.

### Billing Information

School fees will be invoiced annually (at the beginning of the year) with statements being issued at least once per term. Payment plans are to be established to ensure you meet your financial obligations to the college by the end of Term 3 (if fees are not paid in full at the beginning of the year)

### Fee Schedule for 2026:

The school fee may entail a variety of charges which are college specific and could change year on year, including but not limited to tuition fees, operational, resource, stationery, building levies etc.

## Early Bird Discount

If the yearly account is paid in full by the last school day in February, an early bird discount will be applied to the school fees for the year.

## Concession Card Discounts

Parents/Guardians who are the holders of a Health Care Card issued by Services Australia are eligible for the concession card discount per child attending our college. A **current** Health Care Card must be submitted to the college each year for the discount to be applied. If you receive a concession card discount you are not eligible for an additional sibling discount or early bird discount.

## Payment Methods

The college offers various payment methods and frequencies to allow Parent/Guardian to pay school fees by the methods most convenient to their budget. The following invoice payment methods are available

- Direct Debit - contact college reception for a payment authority
- Eftpos – at school site
- Centrelink – deductions from family payments
- BPAY/ bank transfer/ see invoice for details

## Payment Frequency

- **Annual** – Early Bird Discount applies if paid in full by last school day in February.
- **Weekly payments** - 40 weekly payments starting from the first week in February.
- **Fortnightly payments** - 20 fortnightly payments starting from the first week in February.
- **Monthly payments** - 9 monthly payments (Feb -Oct) final payment by last day of school in October
- **3 Term payments** – due last day of the month, 30 April, 31 July, 31 October – (Feb -Oct) final payment by last day of school in October

### Financial Hardship

Parent/Guardian who are experiencing financial hardship are encouraged to contact the Principal or Finance Officer as early as possible to discuss their circumstances. All discussions and arrangements are in the strictest confidence.

### Staff Discounts

Parent/Guardian who is a current staff member of the Catholic Education of the Northern Territory, are encouraged to contact the Principal or Finance Officer for further information regarding the current policies and procedures.

### Withdraw of a Student:

A full-term notice must be given in writing by completing a Student Departure Notification form. This is to be forwarded to the college's reception before a student is withdrawn from the college. Failure to provide the required notice will result in fees being charged for the period by which the notice falls short of a term (1 term = 10 weeks).

### Fee Example:

*One family has 3 siblings within our Catholic Schools in the Northern Territory. 1 student in one of our primary schools, 2 students at O'Loughlin Catholic College, one in year 7, one in year 11.*

*The total school fee payable is calculated in the following way.*

- *Payment is made by the last day of February, allowing the family to utilize the early bird discount.*
- *The school fee and sibling discount for the primary student is calculated in the respective primary school they are attending.*

*The school fee for our college students is calculated the following way.*

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### **2026 Additional Elective Costs**

Additional costs apply to some elective subjects, and these vary throughout year levels (outlined in the table below). These additional costs allow for things such as extra resources, camps and/or excursions to occur within the subject. Please note that these additional subject fees will be billed out when student subject selections have been finalised in Week 4 of Terms 1 and 3.

Failure to pay these additional subject fees by the due date, may result in the student being removed from the elective class. Families who are having financial difficulty paying these costs should contact the College immediately to discuss financial assistance and payment plans.
