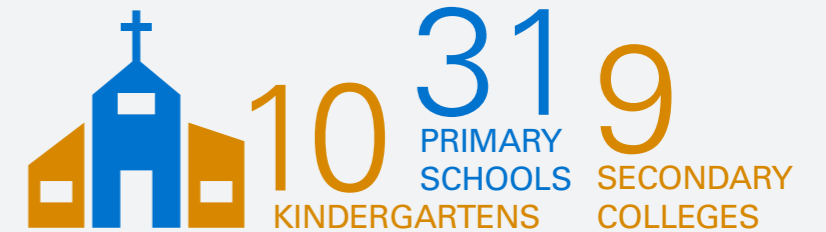
Our Catholic Schools
