

# ACCREDITATION TO TEACH IN A CATHOLIC SCHOOL

**Scope:** This policy applies to all teachers employed in Catholic kindergartens, schools and colleges conducted by Catholic Education - Diocese of Rockhampton (referred to as CEDR in the document).

## 1. POLICY STATEMENT

Every teacher in a Catholic school must be a registered teacher with the Queensland College of Teachers.

Every teacher in a Catholic school in the Diocese of Rockhampton must have accreditation to teach in a Catholic school.

## 2. DESCRIPTION

Accreditation assists all teachers in Catholic schools to develop a deeper understanding of the nature and purpose of Catholic schools as part of the Catholic Church's mission in the world, and the invaluable contribution they make to that mission as members of staff.

## 3. IMPLEMENTATION ISSUES

1. Catholic Education – Diocese of Rockhampton (CEDR) develops and publishes procedures for gaining accreditation to teach in a Catholic school.
2. All teachers have access to information about accreditation procedures in the Diocese of Rockhampton.
3. Records detailing the accreditation status of all teachers are maintained at the Catholic Education Office. These records are updated annually.
