NEW INFO

2. **Mulkadee** has been cancelled for 2020 but will be back again in July of 2021.
3. **Social Distancing** will be further reinforced across both campuses. Please talk with your child about this and why it is important. Additionally, practice this yourself when in the school grounds to set the example with us.

REMINDERS

4. **Secondary classes where safety glasses are worn** (science, technology, etc) will no longer share or loan these glasses. All students in Yrs 7-10 should have them as issued. Students who do not have their own safety glasses will not be permitted to perform any science experiments or practical work in other subjects (that require this PPE).
5. **Parent Teacher Interviews** for Tuesday 31st March have been postponed. We will make a call for the Wednesday 22nd April interviews before the end of this term. Classes as normal.
6. **Junior Campus 'Student of the Week' awards** from Weeks 7&8 will be presented tomorrow (Wednesday 25 March) at 2:20pm in the shelter shed. Only the award recipients from each class will attend. An invitation will be extended to parents to attend if their child is receiving an award.
7. If students are feeling unwell and have flu-like symptoms (fever, cough, sore throat, etc), they are to stay at home. If it develops during the day they will be sent home.
