

CPC10120 CERTIFICATE I IN CONSTRUCTION**QUALIFICATION DESCRIPTION**

This qualification is designed for people seeking a pathway into the building industry via apprenticeships and traineeships. It introduces the construction industry, its culture, occupations, job roles and workplace expectations.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no entry requirements for this qualification, however students need to create/provide a USI.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Students are required to wear leather shoes and school uniform.

DURATION AND LOCATION

This is a two-year course delivered in Years 11 and 12 on site at the Design and Technology & Trade Training Centre at St Augustine's College.

COURSE UNITS

To attain a CPC10120 Certificate I in Construction, 11 units of competency must be achieved:

RTO OBLIGATION

The RTO guarantees that the student will be provided with every opportunity to complete the qualification. We do not guarantee employment upon completion of this qualification.

Students who are deemed competent in all 11 units of competency will be awarded a Qualification and a Record of Results. Students who achieve at least one unit of competency (but not the full qualification) will receive a Statement of Attainment.

DELIVERY MODES

A range of delivery modes will be used during the teaching and learning of this qualification. These include:

- face-to-face instruction
- work-based learning
- guided learning
- online training.

THIRD-PARTY AGREEMENT

There is a Third-party Agreement in place with Skill360 Australia (1607) to deliver the Construction Industry White Card.

FEES

The cost of this course is approximately \$130.00. Additional cost for the Construction Industry White Card is approximately \$80.00.

ASSESSMENT

Assessment is competency based and completed in a simulated Construction Industry environment.

Units of competency are clustered and assessed in this way to replicate what occurs in industry as closely as possible.

Assessment techniques include:

- observation
- folios of work
- questioning
- projects
- written and practical tasks.

WORK PLACEMENT

Students are provided with the opportunity to undertake work placement during this course. The option of work placement is offered during school holidays.

PATHWAYS

There are no specific job outcomes to this qualification, but the skills achieved will assist in successfully undertaking a Certificate II pre-vocational program or job outcome qualification or will facilitate entry into an Australian Apprenticeship.
