Physical Activity & Exercise



Career Corner



Last newsletter I spoke about resumes and cover letters, those important tools to obtaining work experience and jobs. This time, let us focus on School Based Apprenticeships.

Many people have a good idea what they want to do in life and can't wait to get started on it. Others may plan their careers

and want to gain an apprenticeship as the first step in that career.

By starting an apprenticeship in Yr 11 whilst staying at school, about one year of the 4 years can be done. Some points to note:

- It is difficult to gain an apprenticeship at any time if your son hasn't done work experience in that area, possibly with that specific employer. So, work experience is the first step.

- It is up to you and your son to find a prospective employer.
- It is a legal contract, your son will be expected to stay with that employer when he finishes Yr 12. He must be prepared to stay in town until finished.
- It is not an iron-clad guarantee of a continuing job – apprenticeships can be cancelled if the employer runs out of work. Last year three school-based apprentices had their contracts terminated.
- Normally, your son will miss one day of school a week and he will have to catch up on his schoolwork. The school and the employer negotiate which day he goes out.
- Your son will usually drop one subject in the process. Which subject is dropped, is negotiated between the student, parents and the school.

The school has subscribed to a great web site: **My Career Advisor**, which allows all students and their parents to log on to for help with subject selection, career advice, universities, getting a job, etc. **User name:** sbc.qld.edu.au **Password:** sbc4703 Have a look at it, there is great information and links to other sites.



Walk Against Domestic Violence & Edmund Rice Feast Day – Friday 4 May 2018

We encourage students and families to support the Edmund Rice Feast Day celebrations next Friday 4 May 2018, and our second annual Walk Against Domestic Violence. **Parents and students are reminded that attendance is compulsory at school on that day.**

Our 600 plus student and staff contingent will walk in solidarity against family and domestic violence and as one of the largest collectives of men in Central Queensland as sons, brothers and future husbands and fathers, the College is working to ensure the anti-violence message and the importance of service and justice is taken from the school yard, home and into the community.

To support the day, the College has invited SBC Old Boy and Senior 1994, Rob Caslick, as keynote speaker to impart his knowledge, wisdom and experiences to the College community, as the driving force behind a social enterprise, Two Good Co, in Sydney.

Mr Caslick's story is a significant one, with the vision of Two Good Co, 'that no person in a refuge feels unworthy of love' and their mission, 'to be the national provider of beautiful food and lifestyle products to domestic violence refuges and soup kitchens.'

From humble beginnings with three of his mates cooking a BBQ for the homeless in Sydney's Kings Cross, today Two Good Co works on the 'Buy One, Give One' model, so that people in Sydney and Melbourne buy a premium lunch jar for themselves, while the other lunch jar goes to a person in need in a local domestic violence refuge.

And for both the purchaser and the receiver, the food is of the highest quality; with some of Australia's biggest name celebrity chefs including the likes of Neil Perry, Kylie Kwong and Matt Moran donating their recipes to Two Good to support and stand against domestic violence.

Parents and families are invited to attend Mass and hear from our guest speaker Mr Caslick on Friday morning, in support of the day.

The program for the day will run as follows:

8.45am Mass, followed by Special Guest Speaker SBC Old Boy Rob Caslick of Two Good Co

10.30am Walk to the Main Beach, Official Proceedings, Walk Against Domestic Violence and Lunch

1.45pm/2pm – Close and walk back to College for buses and end of school.

Mobile App

- Ensure you are subscribed to relevant channels by going to notification settings and clicking on the channel you need to subscribe to, for example Year 7, sporting notifications etc. (If you are subscribed the bell and channel will show in blue; if you are not subscribed there will be a cross through that particular channel/bell). You will not receive notifications for specific channels if you are not subscribed.
- Ensure mobile data and push notifications are on for the St Brendan's College App (in Settings). It will not work without mobile data on.
- If you believe there has been a notification you may have missed, on Apple phone please pull your finger down from the top of the screen, to open any new notifications. For Android, you will see the SBC icons on the top of your screen.
