



DISCOVERY DAY COVID-19 REGULATIONS 2021

We would like to extend an invite for your son to attend our 2021 Discovery Day so that he may experience a day in the life of a St Brendan's College Student. Discovery Day will be held on 11 March, 2021 from 9am to 2.30pm. In order for your son to attend, he must agree to abide by all regulations put in place for the day.

We will also hold a tour at 4pm for parents who would like to view the College.

For local students who are travelling on buses to the event, our bus contractor will be operating the buses to and from the school.

Once at St Brendan's College students must abide by all COVID-19 regulations put in place at the College by:

- Following the guidelines of all regulated signage
- Sanitising hands on arrival, on entering classrooms and before and after eating.
- Students are required to bring their own water bottles on the day, which can be filled on site.
- Social distancing regulations must be followed
- No handshaking or touching other students
- If a student coughs or sneezes it must be into their elbow or a tissue.
- Students must only touch equipment that they are asked to use.
- On the day of the if your son is feeling unwell or has a cough, fever, sore throat, fatigue or shortness of breath he must stay at home.
- All students must sign in at the entry point.
- No students who arrive on the day without prior RSVP and forms being returned will be able to attend.
- Lunch and morning tea will be proved for the students in individual packaging.

On the day of the event 11th March, 2021 if your son answers yes to any of the following he cannot attend the event.

- Have you been overseas in the past 14 days?
- Have you been to a COVID-19 hotspot in the past 14 days?
- Have you had contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19 in the past 14 days?
- Have you been diagnosed with COVID-19 and no been released from isolation?
- Have you been issued with a self-quarantine/self-isolation notice in the past 14 days?
- Have you had a COVID-19 test and not received your results yet?
- In the past 24 hours have you had any of the following symptoms- fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, runny nose, fatigue?
