### EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT AND PROGRESS

Shalom's curriculum provides a balanced approach ensuring literacy, numeracy, Indigenous culture, social skills, sport and health are learnt in a spiritual and supportive environment. We follow the National Accelerated Literacy Program providing written reports to parents each term. We also have a support program for students with special needs e.g. English as a second language.

Students take part in all activities including: PE, Library, Dance and Christian Education.

### CULTURAL DEVELOPMENT

Traditional culture plays an important part in the development of our students at Shalom. Designated cultural group classes see students learn and practice different aspects of their cultures and often share this through dancing, songs or stories. Shalom celebrates Mabo Day and NAIDOC each year. Indigenous Liaison Officers work closely with students to provide a strong cultural link between remote communities and students.



### HEALTH AND WELLBEING

Shalom understands that sometimes students need extra support to maintain their health and wellness, so it provides many support services to assist students and families. We have counselors and a school nurse available full time. The Dental Van, Hearing Health Unit and Life Education Van visits the College regularly.



### SPORT

Students are offered a wide program of activities to develop their sporting and social skills with qualified instructors. The Shalom Academy of Sport is designed to use sport and recreation as a vehicle to engage indigenous students in their schooling and to improve academic and vocational outcomes for a brighter future



### ANNUAL HIGHLIGHTS

Shalom provides a range of events over the school year, including: Easter Pageant, Swimming Carnival, Cross Country Day, Harmony Day, Shalom Athletics, NAIDOC day, Mini Olympics, Christmas Pageant and Graduation Day. Parents are encouraged to attend most events.
