Bosco Beginners

Our Pre-Prep Transition Program "Bosco Beginners" will commence in Week 5 (Next FRIDAY) of Term 3 and will continue in Term 4. This program will only be available this year for students who have now been enrolled in Prep for 2026. Information regarding the dates and specific details of this program will be sent home with families this week.

Writing at SJB

At St John Bosco, we are excited to use the 6+1 Writing Traits to help our students become better writers. This framework focuses on seven key areas:



Ideas: Developing clear and interesting main ideas.

Organization: Structuring writing with a beginning, middle, and end.

Voice: Letting each student's unique personality shine through their writing.

Word Choice: Choosing precise and vivid words to make writing more powerful.

Sentence Fluency: Writing sentences that flow smoothly and are easy to read.

Conventions: Using correct grammar, spelling, and punctuation.

Presentation: Making sure writing is neat and easy to read.

This approach supports students in developing essential skills in text structure, language features, and grammar, as outlined in the curriculum. By integrating these traits into our teaching, we ensure our students are meeting national standards while becoming confident and effective communicators.

School jumpers are available for purchase from the school office—\$38.50 each.




Please ensure your child's jumper is
