# Year 3/4

In Mathematics, the Year 3/4 students have been learning about data collection and representation. Students worked collaboratively to create their own survey questions, carefully considering their audience and the information they wanted to collect. To gather data, we invited our Prep students to visit our classroom and participate in the surveys. The Year 3/4 students did a fantastic job asking questions, recording responses and interacting respectfully with their younger peers.

Over the coming weeks, students will organise and analyse their results using frequency tables and spreadsheets before creating a range of graphs to represent their data. They will also compare different graph types and discuss which visual displays are most effective for communicating information. We are looking forward to seeing the conclusions students draw from their investigations!
