RELIGIOUS LIFE OF ST JOSEPH'S - 2025

This year in the Catholic faith was a Jubilee year, with our school theme being 'Pilgrims of Hope'. St Mary of the Cross Mackillop used to say: 'We are but travellers here.' The connection this meant for us at St Joseph's is to aim to make our journey, our pilgrimage through life as meaningful as possible, seizing every opportunity in each moment we are given. The most fulfilling lives are those devoted to love and dedicated to serving God and others. By living the values of our school Love, Serve, Lead and Strive through our actions, we have opportunities to create a meaningful and impactful life not just for ourselves, but for others as well.

Our year began with our Beginning of Year Mass, where we officially blessed the school year, our students and our 2025 School Leaders – Knox Swalling, Ada McIntyre and Flinders and Kennedy House Captains – Georgia Battle, James Barker, Gemma Douglas and, Scarlett Blinco.

The Lenten season began in week 6 with Shrove Tuesday pancakes delivered to each classroom to enjoy, cooked by our Spirit in Action students. Lenten promises from staff and students were collected and burnt in preparation for the 'ashes' needed for our Ash Wednesday liturgy, which was celebrated with Fr Nnaemeka in St Colman's Church. During Lent this year, Mini Vinnies and Spirit in Action students strived to raise much-needed funds in support of Project Compassion through the chocolate toss, guess the Easter eggs competition, and sale of icy cups on Fridays. We successfully raised over \$700 through these fundraisers and direct donations. These funds support different initiatives to improve and empower the lives of many people around the world. I sincerely thank everyone for supporting the Project Compassion fundraising this year.

The rest of the term saw us come together and celebrate Harmony Day, acknowledging we are all God's Children, St Joseph's Feast Day and finishing off the term with a meaningful Stations of the Cross reenactment by the year 6 students.

In term two, Bishop Tim Harris travelled here for our official school blessing and opening ceremony of our newly built spaces and classrooms and presided over the Sacraments of Confirmation and First Communion for several candidates. We commemorated Anzac Day in our courtyard and were fortunate to have visiting defence force personnel join us, along with representatives from the RSL. Class retreats were extended to the primary school and provided opportunties for stuents to explore Gospel values and undertake activities aligned with year level curriculum.

Our Call to Action assemblies continued often with a liturgical focus as we celebrated and acknowledged many important celebrations including National Sorry Day, and NAIDOC week in term 3. To mark the celebration of Catholic Education, our Spirit in Action students walked around town and gave out cards of gratitude to businesses, acknowledging their appreciation for the contribution given to the community. Celebrations continued as we marked Mary MacKillop's Feast Day with cream buns and sausages on bread.

The Spirit in Action students continued supporting by our local Vinnies store and lending a hand where they could, as well as supporting Sister Lyn with the many charitable acts she does to help others. Mini Vinnies students organised a 'Dressed by Vinnies' drive, and on the last day of the term, all students were able to show off their purchases and efforts of supporting another worthwhile cause.

The busyness continued in term four, with the commencement of World Mission Month. This year Catholic Mission's focus country was Zambia. We held our Catholic Mission mass led by Fr Mick and followed this with a Socktober shootout for Flinders and Kennedy to gain points for successful goals scored. The sale of icy cups during October through to the end of the term saw our community raise in excess of \$1200.00.

In recognition of the founders of our school, The Josephite Sisters and their contribution to Catholic Education in western Queensland, students celebrated with the annual colour fun run, which will surely be remembered for a long time. Denise and Healthy Harold from Life Education came for another visit and also bearing gifts for our primary students of a backpack, library bag and water bottle. The students shared in a liturgy led by Fr Will for Remembrance Day and decorated our courtyard with chalk drawings, an initiaitye from RSL.

In Week 8 we celebrated our End of Year and Year 9 Graduation Mass with Fr Mick and farewelled our departing students, families, and staff. The Mini Vinnies students continued their efforts to fundraise for the Christmas Appeal to support local families in need.



We finished the year by celebrating their achievements at our End of Year Awards Night, recognising the dedication, pride, and positive contribution both students have made to our school community.




