#### **SCHOOL ATTENDANCE**

Please make sure that your child/ren are attending school each day (unless they are ill). This is very important for their social and emotional development as well as their education. There are many things that we can do as a school to assist families in this

area. Referral to a support service such as Family and Child Connect can be done. These referrals can be done with or without consent. If concerns continue, Townsville Catholic Education Student Protection will be consulted on further advice and action to authorities. If your child/ren are absent for medical, family reasons etc please log this on compass or contact the school immediately so we are able to log this for you.

Students arriving late is becoming a regular occurrence! If your child is not here on time (especially in Prep, Year 1 and Year 2), they are missing important foundational literacy as this is the time it is taught.

#### **SCHOOL FEES**

School Fees have been issued for the term. ALL families are expected to pay school fees as stated in the signed enrolment agreement. This is a very important contribution to our school as the fees do support us in providing the best education for your child/ren. I do understand that things come up which makes it difficult to meet financial commitments and it is a very sensitive and private matter. Each family's circumstances are taken into account and I have the authority to put in place a 'principal's concession' for a period of time around individual circumstances. 

## Classroom News

#### Prep:

What a fantastic Term 2 we've had in Prep! Our students have been busy learning new letters and sounds, building strong foundations for reading and writing. One of the highlights this term was our Drama sessions, where the children had a wonderful time recreating and retelling fairy tales - their creativity and enthusiasm really shone! In STEM, we explored different materials and enjoyed hands-on experiences building and designing. It's been amazing to see the students working collaboratively, thinking critically, and experimenting with their ideas. Even more special has been watching the friendships grow in our classroom. The children have developed lovely connections with one another and are becoming more confident and caring classmates each day. We're also looking ahead with excitement – next term, we celebrate our 100 days of Prep and the students will join the rest of the school for the second break. They can't wait to be part of this next big step! Well done to all our Prep learners for a wonderful term of growth, learning and fun!

#### Year 1:

Wow, Wow, Wow! What a term we've had in Year One! We became creative reporters, exploring all kinds of animals and finishing with our final information report on elephants. Did you know elephants are the largest land animals in the world? That's one fun fact Year One was excited to share! We also designed environments to help elephants survive and even grew our own plants to learn about the needs of living things. Although Miss Chandler *may* have accidentally killed our class plant, it turned

into an amazing learning opportunity. We now know just how important sunlight, water, healthy soil and our care really are! In Maths this term, we've been busy building our number knowledge and problem-solving skills. We've learnt how to compare time, count all the way up to 120, and read and write two-digit numbers with confidence. We also explored odd and even numbers and tackled all sorts of number challenges. Year One is well on its way to becoming expert mathematicians! Next term we are looking forward to fun learning experiences including a couple of exciting visitors. We are also going to start Show and Share which is a hot topic in class at the moment. Please enjoy a restful and safe break. See you soon Year One Superheroes!

#### Year 2:

Year 2 students have had a magnificent term of learning and growth. In English, students learnt new digraphs such as 'ue' and 'ew', and trigraphs such as 'igh', and practised using these to spell words. Students also learnt how to write information reports following a specific structure on a range of topics such as our favourite Cowboys player, Cowboy Tilly and Lake Moondarra. In mathematics, students mastered simple fractions and practised using vertical algorithms to solve addition and subtraction problems. Students really enjoyed our Science unit this term, learning all about sound waves. A highlight was designing and creating our own instruments in our STEM lessons. Students created a range of instruments such as guitars, rain sticks and drums. We are grateful for an amazing term of learning and are looking forward to Semester 2.



#### Year 3:

Year 3 has had an amazing term of learning! We have designed our own playground in Maths after collecting data and analysing different types of angles. In Science and STEM we have investigated the different layers of rocks. We even made edible rocks, which the students loved! In HASS we learnt all about Australian states and territories, and landmarks. Students created a powerpoint presentation comparing Mount Isa and another town's climate, natural features, and man-made features. In English, we learnt how to write an explanation text, and students wrote how to plan for a holiday. It has been a busy term, but I have loved seeing all the kids excited to learn!

#### Year 4:

It was a busy and exciting term in Year 4 filled with engaging learning experiences. We explored the climates, vegetation, animals, and biomes of different continents, learnt about Christian communities and the history of the Catholic Church while creating dioramas, and developed our skills in writing factual recounts. We recounted recent events such as the Mother's Day Fete. We also experimented with various visual art techniques such as colour, shapes, and line. In science, we had fun investigating the importance and properties of materials we tested contraptions designed to protect a falling egg and created sustainability posters to promote environmental awareness. We also investigated the connection between fractions and decimals in math. Finally, we completed assessments to showcase all of our learning. Overall, it was a productive and rewarding term, and

we are looking forward to more exciting and fun learning in Term 3.

#### Year 5:

Wow! Where has Term Two gone? The Year 5 students have taken the many changes this term in their stride and have been working hard. They have engaged in a wide range of learning experiences to further develop their knowledge and skills.

In English, they read *War Horse*, wrote narratives and created book covers using AI. In Media Arts and Science, students investigated light and designed stop-motion animations using light and shadow to communicate mood and point of view for an audience.

In Mathematics, students have been learning about 24-hour time, factors and multiples, and how to use protractors to measure angles. These are just a few of the many exciting activities students completed this term.

Students also enjoyed a pizza party during their final Team Up session, which is run by PCYC. They should be proud of the positive communication and leadership skills they developed and demonstrated throughout the term. The staff from PCYC commented that the students worked brilliantly and should be commended for their efforts.

#### Year 6:

What an incredible journey Year 6 has had this term! As we reach the end of another term, it's the perfect time to pause and reflect on all that we've accomplished so far. Some learning highlights in Year 6 this term include creating our own arcade games, learning how to write a factual recount, mastering many complex mathematical concepts, and being incredibly persuasive in their HaSS unit, where they had to create a



law that all Australians would have to follow. All of our Year 6 students


have grown into curious, capable learners. Their creativity, thoughtful questions, and determination have shone through in every subject. A highlight outside the classroom was when the Year 6 class won the touch football game against the staff — and yes, they're still bragging about it! It has been a wonderful privilege to teach this beautiful group of children, who never give up and continue to inspire with their resilience and spirit.

Our first gala day for the term was soccerwe did really well and competed against a number of other schools in Mount Isa.






Netball was next and our girls came 3rd overall out of 11 teams which was an amazing achievement!
