STEM News

This term in STEM, our year 4, 5 and 6 students will be participating in Wonder of Science. Wonder of Science inspires students to engage in rigorous, real-world STEM learning. Students develop a response to a Challenge Task over the course of a term supported by two visits from Young Science Ambassadors (YSAs) who are inspiring PhD students researching in STEM fields. Students (typically two teams per class) then attend a Regional Conference in their area to present the results of their Challenge Task.

Class Update

Prep

It has been a wonderful start to the term. The students got straight back into their learning and are excited for the upcoming term. In English, students will continue to learn their alphabet letters and sounds and begin learning all about digraphs. In Mathematics, students are continuing to learn about numbers to 20, measurement and compare objects and events as well as describing the location of themselves and objects. In Religion, we are looking at Celebrations and Rituals and choosing between right and wrong. (Choosing Love, Forgiveness & Compassion). In Science, students are learning about physical sciences and are looking at how objects move. In Health, we are looking at Healthier Choices. We celebrated our 100 days of school and we had the best day! A favourite was playing with the slime and dress-



ups! We are looking forward to showcasing our Bush Dance and Mini Murri's in Week 3!

Religion, we are learning about Praise and Sacraments of Initiation.

Year 1

Year I have been working hard. We are writing recounts in English, and in HASS learning about natural and man-made environments. This term in maths we will cover a variety of concepts including place value, counting large collections and using directions. In Science we will investigate 'push' and 'pull. In Health we will learn all about our community and look forward to some of our special visitors. We look forward to sharing our learning with you later in the term.

Year 2

Year 2 students have dived into learning this term, approaching lessons with interest and enthusiasm. In English, students are learning how to read and write words with 'bossy e' spelling patterns. In maths, students are continuing to practice vertical addition and subtraction sums, and will soon apply their skip counting skills to learn times tables facts. Students have embraced our new Science unit on Space and Earth Sciences with much excitement. We look forward to learning about the solar system, different planets and star constellations throughout the term.

Year 3

Year 3 has started this term being busy bees! We have been learning all about personal responses in English with the mentor text, "Finding Our Heart," and will be looking at an information report, responding to the text, "The Iron Man." In Maths we are learning all about quarter to and quarter past time and will also look at money and fractions. We are also learning about living things and classifying them in Biological Sciences. In HASS we are learning how our community has changed over time. In

Year 4

We've had a super busy and exciting start to Term 3 in Year Four! In Science, we've been diving into the water cycle and have even started an experiment with Mrs Smith as part of our STEM learning. In Maths, we've been measuring perimeter around the school and in our classroom. For English, we're reading the classic *Storm Boy*, which has sparked some great discussions about caring for the environment and our connection to the land and animals.

In Religion, we've been exploring morals and the everyday choices we make. We're also sharpening our Reading skills with fun and engaging rotations throughout the week. Students are enjoying time reading with both the teacher and school officer, as well as getting stuck into shared reading in small groups.

Next week, we're kicking off our Health unit with the *Deadly Choices* program *Good Quick Tukka*. The students will be learning about making healthy food choices and even doing some cooking!

On top of all that, the students are working hard on their Bush Dance item. There's so much going on, and we're all having a fantastic term so far!

Year 5

Year 5 have given me a very warm welcome to their class and to St. Kieran's - I could not be happier to be a part of this amazing group of students!



We have begun our novel study and our Mathematics unit for this term. In Science we are looking at how animals adapt to their environments, and we will be working closely with Mrs Smith in STEM lessons to continue this theme.

Term 3 is a very busy term with extracurricular activities and events, which adds to the excitement that awaits Year 5 this term.

Year 6

It's been wonderful getting to know Year 6 students this week. I look forward to meeting families soon! While the week has been spent focusing on establishing expectations and routines, we have begun work on Term 3 English and Mathematics units. Our novel for study this term is 'Once' by Morris Gleitzman. We are all really enjoying it (Mr Khan and myself included!) and eagerly await each chapter. The Mathematics focus is using the formula for calculating the area of a rectangle (length x width = area). Science will begin next week, with an examination of the way the rotation and tilt of Earth affect natural phenomena (seasons, length of day etc.).


