

From the Principal

Dear Families,

It is hard to believe that we are at the end of Term 3!. The term has definitely been a busy one! I have enjoyed visiting the classrooms and watching students engage in a range of activities to show their learning.

In Term 4 the St Keiran's Leadership Team will begin to prepare the timeline for our year of Renewal in 2026. School Renewal is undertaken in a systematic and planned ways by members of the school community under the leadership of the Principal and in consultation with Townsville Catholic education Office.

The desired future directions which emanate from the process of Renewal are formulated into School Improvement Priorities and implemented through successive Annual School Improvement Plans. Catholic School Renewal is underpinned by a continuous cycle of Review, Plan and Take Action.

Catholic schools operate within a context that calls for high accountability and great vision. In the Townsville Catholic Diocese, all schools must demonstrate compliance with legislation administered by the Non-state Schools Accreditation Board (NSSAB) and a commitment to continual improvement.



The School Renewal timeline will be shared with the community during Term 4.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

Please make sure that your child/ren are attending school each day (unless they are ill). This is very important for their social and emotional development as well as their education. There are many things that we can do as a school to assist families in this area. Referral to a support service such as Family and Child Connect can be done. These referrals can be done with or without consent. If concerns continue, Townsville Catholic Education Student Protection will be consulted on further advice and action to authorities. If your child/ren are absent for medical, family reasons etc please log this on compass or contact the school immediately so we are able to log this for you.



Students arriving late is becoming a regular occurrence! If your child is not here on time (especially in Prep, Year 1 and Year 2), they are missing important foundational literacy as this is the time it is taught.

It is better to model and mentor screen use, rather than monitor it. Children tend to do more of what they see us do, and less of what we tell them to do. Parents need to remain firm in their approach to managing screen time. Excessive screen time can be detrimental to a child's overall wellbeing. Ensuring the correct privacy settings are in place is vital to prevent children from being inadvertently exposed to inappropriate content or online predators. Parents need to also be mindful of the potential impact screen time can have on a child's social, emotional, educational, behavioural, and even physical domains.

First Nations Voices

Indigenous Literacy Day:

On Wednesday the 3rd September we recognised Indigenous Literacy Day with a range of engaging activities. The day celebrated the rich cultures and stories of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and raised awareness about the importance of literacy in remote communities. Throughout the day, classes engaged with First Nations books and stories during lessons and library borrowing times, giving students the chance to explore First Nations perspectives through literature. At lunchtime, students also had the opportunity to read books by First Nations authors, including some written in Indigenous languages. They created their own stories on whiteboards using Aboriginal symbols and designed bookmarks featuring Australian animals in Aboriginal design. These activities were linked to the theme -Strength in Our Stories: For Now & Future Generations.

Prep students have had an amazing term! We have learnt all of our letter names, sounds and all of our tricky words! We are looking forward to beginning our HASS unit on the history of our local place and investigating significant places and communities in the Mount Isa region.

Year 3 has had a wonderful term! In Design Technologies and STEM, students took on the design process and created a marble run. They got to plan, collaborate and build their marble runs throughout the out term. In English students wrote an information report on Australia and the different wildlife you

can find. Students were super mathematicians, as they looked at time, money, and fractions! We have had a busy term, but we are looking forward to Term 4 and a relaxing holiday!

Year 4:

We have enjoyed a fantastic Term 3 filled with rich and engaging learning experiences. In Science and STEM, students explored the topic of water, investigating its properties and importance. In English, they read and analysed the Australian classic novel *Storm Boy* and wrote informative texts about rivers of Australia. Maths learning was brought to life through real-world applications, focusing on time, measurement, and continuing to build multiplication skills.

In Religion, students explored the importance of prayer and different types of prayer, while in HASS they examined the role of laws and rules in our society. A special highlight this term was welcoming Miss Shi-Lee from Deadly Choices, who shared the *Good Quick Tukka* program with us. Students learned about making healthy food choices in fun and interactive ways, helping them understand how nutrition supports their overall wellbeing.

There has been lots of fun learning in collaborative ways, as well as students building on their individual learning goals and achieving proudly in all areas. What a busy and exciting Term 3 it has been!

Many of the CBCA (Children's Book Council of Australia) short-listed books, by Australian authors & illustrators, were read by students & teachers alike.


Classes experienced a special livestream & interactive performance called "Treasure Hunt" by Perform Education.
