Making Magical Music in Prep – Year 2!

Guidance Counsellor

Strong minds, kind hearts

As we move through the school term, children continue to learn many important life skills - not just in the classroom, but also through friendships, challenges and everyday experiences. One important skill we help children build is resilience.

Resilience means being able to bounce back when things do not go the way we hoped. Children may feel disappointed when they lose a game, make a mistake or have friendship worries. These feelings are normal and are all part of growing up.

As adults, we can support children by encouraging them to talk about their feelings and reminding them that everyone faces challenges sometimes. Children learn resilience when they are given opportunities to try again, solve problems and keep going even when things feel hard. Simple phrases such as *'What could you try next time?'* or *'I'm proud of you for not giving up'* can help children develop the confidence to persevere.

At St Peter's, we continue to encourage kindness, problem-solving, and positive coping skills. Working with our families, we can help our students to understand that disappointment does not last forever and that setbacks can help us to be stronger, braver, and more confident over time.
