Staffing Update:

Renewal Of The College Phone Policy:

The College recently wrote to parents/guardians to engage in a consultative process to determine the policy settings for our mobile phone and social media policy for 2023 and beyond. Until date, the College has held a 'responsible use' policy position, whereby students have been permitted:

- To bring their mobile phone to school
- Access their mobile phone during breaks
- Utilise their mobile phone in class for approved purposes (at teacher discretion)

Whilst the majority of students have respected the 'responsible use' policy position, mobile phones and social media continue to raise concern in the College and wider community. Assistant Principal Religious Education, Mr Richard Bryant will be coordinating the consultative process and leading the policy development. Renewal of the House (Sports) Polos:

In 2020 (for 2021) the College renewed our uniform to the current red polo. Current stock levels now present the opportunity to renew the House (sports) polos to be aligned with our red polo. This will be phased in over the coming year as stock levels of the current sports polos diminish and are replaced with the renewed design. Students are not required to purchase / replace their current sports polo, this will gradually take place over time. The renewed House polos include: white piping as per the red polo, the SJ Eagles sports crest and updated embroidery of the House crests. In addition, 2024/2025 should present the opportunity to reintroduce Doneley House as enrolments grow. A colour, symbol and Larrakia mascot are still to be determined. Given the success of House Spirit Fridays, the College will institute this across most Fridays in 2023, where students will be expected to wear their House polo.

BGA - 2023:

Just a short update to inform the community that our application for capital works funding for 2023 is still progressing through the Block Grant Authority. Recently the Priorities Committee visited the College to view the site of our application – the installation of external CCTV across the Hartzer and Chevalier Campus. The BGA is a competitive process, and with the 2023 program oversubscribed, the College patiently awaits a decision in late November / early December.

Renewal of the House Uniforms - Coming 2023







Bring Your Own Designated Device (BYOOD) Laptop Program:

St John's Catholic College is transitioning to a Bring Your Own Designated Device (BYODD) laptop program.

The program commences with Year 7 in 2023 and will be phased in over the coming years. Students are required to bring their own laptop to school daily, as part of their learning equipment. St John's will implement a dual (supported and unsupported) BYODD laptop program giving students and families flexibility and choice.

BYODD Implementation Schedule:

- 2023: Year 7 + any other interested student (senior students recommended)
- 2024: Year 7 & 8 + any other interested student (senior students recommended)
- 2025: Year 7, 8 & 9 + any other interested student (senior students recommended)
- 2026: All students (Years 7 12) to have transitioned to the BYODD laptop program

Please note that ABSTUDY funded Boarders will have their BYODD laptop coordinated by the College (commencing with Year 7 in 2023). All other students including non-ABSTUDY funded Boarders will need to coordinate their own laptop in accordance with the information supplied below.

Bring Your Own Designated Device (BYODD) Laptop Program - Supported Program:

The College has partnered with technology for education firm Edunet for the BYODD supported program. Families selecting this option purchase one of three designated laptops through the Edunet portal from a 'good, better, best' price and specification structure. By participating in the supported program students receive access to College WiFi, use of the College Image (software / programs) and IT support, as well as the resourcing, support and benefits of the Edunet program. Compulsory items within the package include a software imaging, three-year warranty, carry bag and an 'eduskin'. The College highly recommends families purchase insurance either through the Edunet portal or through their Home and Contents insurance policy.

Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) Laptop Program Unsupported Program:

Students are also permitted to bring their own choice of laptop (meeting the listed minimum specifications below) through the BYOD unsupported program. The term 'unsupported program' refers to students/families being responsible for all matters associated with the device – purchase, warranty, programs, maintenance, insurance, etc. Please note that there is no guarantee that BYOD devices will be able to access the NT Schools Network and connect with the College WiFi. The College will only provide limited IT Support to students electing to participate in the unsupported BYOD program. Although not mandated, Apple and Google Chrome devices are not recommended for the BYOD unsupported program due to their incompatibility with the NT Schools network.

FAQs - Page 1

Where is my order delivered?

- IF your school has Australia Post, the device will be delivered to your nominated address. We recommend considering putting your work address because Australia Post won't leave the device without someone there to sign. If delivery is unsuccessful, the device will be returned to the nearest Aust Post depot for you to collect within 10 days.
- **IF** your school has no Australia Post, the device will be delivered to you school for them to setup. The school will be in contact with you to collect once the device is ready.

Which device should I choose?

This will largely depend on the subjects your student is doing, always seek advice from the school if you're unsure. As a general rule most of your student's work will be web browsing and word documentation, which doesn't require a powerful/expensive device. It's only when the student is doing media / art / graphics subjects that you may need to consider a device with a better Processor or more RAM.

If your student isn't doing art or graphical subjects we always recommend looking at the cheaper/more durable Education specific models!

If I choose Zip finance, when do the repayments start?

Your once off account setup fee of \$99 will be taken out immediately (if you haven't got an account already). Your repayments won't begin until the device has been delivered by Edunet.

Can I hand this device down to a younger sibling?

Absolutely! All warranty/insurance purchased follows the device, regardless of who's using it.

Can we get a discount for a purchase of more than one?

We don't require parents to buy multiple devices to take advantage of a bulk discount. Edunet negotiates with the brands of the devices to get a bulk discounted price for Education. The price you get for one device already has a bulk buy discount applied because Edunet supplies to hundreds of schools across the state.

What is the difference between warranty and insurance?

Warranty covers manufacturer's faults, whereas Insurance covers accidental damage caused by your student. For example dropping the device and breaking the screen, or liquid damage would be covered by Insurance. We recommend reading the PDS on our website on the insurance for more details.

Can I purchase spare chargers or other accessories?

Yes. Additional chargers or replacement pens/bags can be purchased via our accessories portal below:

Can we do split payments?

Yes you can, but Edunet cannot process your order until full payment has been received. Please ensure the order's confirmation number is put in the payment description when payment is processed otherwise we will not know which order to put the money against.

Can we order with Zip over the phone?

We cannot help with processing an order over the phone if you want to use Zip financing. This is because Zip requires your personal banking information.

What happens if I'm declined by Zip?

First step is to get in contact with Zip directly. They may just require some additional information to then approve your order. If you have been declined it's best to speak with your school around what options they may have available to you.

What are the compulsory / mandatory items?

The school may want you to purchase particular options to ensure the device is protected. Common mandatory selections is a 3 year onsite warranty. Edunet cannot remove these mandatory items without written approval by your school.

What happens if my device stops working?

First step is to take it to the school in case it's something software related they can fix immediately. If they can't fix it they'll lodge a service job with Edunet's Repair team and we'll be in touch to organise a repair.

Upfront Payment

Edunet provides two options for upfront payment through the portal.

The first option is to pay by any VISA or Mastercard. Note that all card payments incur a 1.5% surcharge that's passed on from the bank.

The second option is to direct deposit the full amount into our bank account. There is no charge for doing this. Parents can make the transfer via their online banking or go directly to their Bank branch and deposit there.



What are the costs?

- Once off account set up fee if you don't already have a Zip account. This starts at \$25 for an order up to \$2,000, \$45 for \$3,000 and \$99 up to \$5,000.
- \$7.95 monthly account fee (only while there is a balance left)
- Standard credit card interest <u>ONLY</u> on residual amount after 12 months.

You won't be charged extra for paying the loan off before the 12-month period, and more importantly parents incur no additional charge for selecting zip instead paying by Credit Card or Bank transfer.

Dear Members of the St John's Catholic College Community,

One of our strategic goals as part of our Annual School Improvement Plan (ASIP) is to further develop our College and House identity, pride and spirit. In recent years, the College has: renewed the college uniform, designed a sports logo, introduced a sports uniform and placed key signage around the grounds. In 2023, our house shirts will be renewed in line with college uniform (see below).

During Term 2, the College trialed the wearing of House Shirts on selected Fridays. Given the overwhelming success of this trial, House Spirit Fridays has been extended into Semester 2, with a view to instituting House Spirit Fridays as a regular part of the College structure and uniform expectations.

Therefore, House Shirts (Daley, Burford, and O'Loughlin) will continue to be permitted and encouraged to be worn in place of the red school uniform on selected Fridays (see below) during Term 4. Please note, all other uniform expectations remain in place. The intent behind the trial is to build identity, pride, and spirit in our vertical pastoral care house system, whilst at the same time increasing the visibility and usage of House Shirts.

Interim Reports

In Semester 1 the College implemented a new software package for reporting called Accelerus. This resulted in a more contemporary and visual report. Accelerus will also be used for our Interim Reports.

The College is in the process of setting up Accelerus to email reports to parents/guardians. As such, our Interim reports will be mailed out this term.

Please ensure that your email address is up to date with our College Administration team prior to Week 4 in Term 4 to receive your Semester reports via email.

As with the Semester Reports we will include a report guide to aid in reading your son/daughter's report.

We will continue to refine the format of the reports provided. In the future we hope to include a graph illustrating your child's achievement in relation to the their class and EALD phases for in Accelerus.

Year 12 Students

Year 12 students should now be close to completing their Stage 2 courses.

A reminder to Year 12 students that all coursework for your subjects will be completed by Friday Week 10 Term 3. All school-based assessment should be completed by this date. The first version of the SACE Exam timetable is now available; however, is subject to change and does not yet include the languages oral and written exams.

Students are required to achieve a 'C-' or better in 3 subjects (60 credits) at Stage 2 in order to qualify for the NTCET. This is in conjunction with the 140 credits at a 'C' grade or better at a Stage 1 or 2 level and the successful completion of the compulsory subjects (PLP, 2 x literacy, 1 x numeracy units).

To achieve an ATAR (university entrance score), students are required to undertake 90 credits worth of Stage 2 subjects.

StudentsOnline - SACE Results portal for students

Year 12 students must log into StudentsOnline, the SACE results portal for students, in order to access their results and ATAR at the end of the year. Students must log into the portal and ensure that they have ticked 'yes' to the sharing preferences. By not doing this, you may restrict your result access, which may include not generating an ATAR as you have not ticked 'yes' to sharing with SATAC.

Edmodo - ceases service 22 September 2022



As many of you would be aware, a notification has appeared on Edmodo stating that Edmodo will cease service effective on the 22 September 2022.

There was no previous communication regarding this, and the College is working to transition to a new platform. The College had been exploring Google Workspace for Education prior to the announcement from Edmodo, we will now accelerate our plans to move to this platform.

Google Workspace for Education will provide teachers and students with access to a wider range of resources and works in the same manner as Edmodo.

Google Workspace - Google Classroom

Our staff have begun using Google Classroom with classes over the last few weeks. Students should be submitting their tasks and accessing class material through Google Classroom from now on. Students will be using Google apps such as Docs, Slides, Jamboard etc in classes which are supported through Google Classroom. A plagiarism checker is also integrated into Google Classroom.

We will begin adding parents/guardians to classrooms in Term 4. Parents/Guardians can set how often a summary of work will be received for each class through email. More information will be provided in Term 4.



FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL: RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Prayer

During the past term Middle School Religion Classes have been studying a unit on Prayer and Sacramentality The learning intention for this unit involved what is prayer and the differing ways in which we can pray.

Students in one session began by preparing a prayer chain which was made from paper strips connected together to form a lengthy intersessional chain of prayers. By the end of the session students had formed a chain 15 meters long! In reading these prayers some were dedicated to family, others to Ukraine and some for our Year 12 students praying for their strength in the final weeks of secondary schooling.

Another aspect of the prayer was to re-visit a well-known Bible Passage and re-enact it focusing on the key message of that passage. The enthusiasm in which students embraced this activity was infectious. One could not help but be drawn into the excitement of this activity and, of course the drama production.

At the end of the lesson students used a form of prayer called the Examen. The Examen is a technique of prayerful reflection on the events of the day in order to detect God's presence and discern his direction for us. The Examen is an ancient practice in the Church that can help us see God's hand at work in our whole experience. This form of prayer bought the students back from the excitement of the previous activities to a quiet and calm state. Students were encouraged to use this form of meditation daily as part of recognising that God is present with us each day

Boarders' Masses

Our Boarders this term attended Mass each weekend in various locations across Darwin. One Mass of significance this term was at St Mary's Star of the Sea War Memorial Cathedral for the celebration of the 60th Anniversary of it's opening and blessing and the 50th Anniversary of its Consecration. Over these years the Cathedral has been a place of welcome for St John's Community. This Mass like all masses was enriched by the presence of all our Boarders. Student Leaders and Staff.

During the Mass we learned more about the history of the Cathedral and how it had been rebuilt three times following the Bombing of Darwin and a Cyclone. The Cathedral doors are always open for us and we feel welcomed each time celebrate mass there.

Bishop Charles reminded us though that the Cathedral itself, impressive and modern as it is, is just a building. The people that attend and celebrate mass are the people that make the Catholic community of Darwin what it is today.


Stage One Spirituality Religion and Meaning revisited The Cathedral a week later to celebrate the Feast Day of St Mary with St Mary's Catholic Primary School. In that celebration we learned more about the Cathedral and the significance of the artwork around the Cathedral. One piece resonated with us was in the image of the 14th station of the cross. This Stations of the Cross mosaic commemorates Father William Michael Henschke and were unveiled on the golden jubilee of his priesthood in 1964.

Father Henschke was born in South Australia in 1889, and was ordained in St. Mary`s Cathedral, Sydney, in 1914, and came to the Northern Territory in 1915. He was attached to the Cathedral Parish of Darwin continuously from 1922 until shortly before his death on 9th November, 1972. Henschke is of course the name of the main campus at St John's Catholic College.



FROM THE DIRECTOR OF BOARDING





In creating a culture of safety within our Boarding House, some of the factors that we consider and emulate in our practice, are below, taken form the National Principles of Child Safe Organisations 2021.

In summary, a child safe organisation is one that actively:

- Creates an environment where children's safety and welbeing are the centre of the organisation's inspiration, values and actions
- Places emphasis on genuine engagement with and valuing of children
- Creates conditions that reduce the likelihood of harm to children
- Creates conditions that increase the likelihood of identifying any harm
- Responds to any concerns, disclosures, allegations or suspicions
- Creates child-friendly mechanisms for a child's voice to be heard



We recently started a process to open up structured conversations about how our students are doing and to find out what are the things that matter to them right now. The process is called Circle Time, we hold this meeting in each of our dorm areas and it is facilitated by houseparents on shift.

We seek to engage our students in conversations, and create structures which give them a voice in matters that affect them. We also conduct student surveys twice a term for this purpose. The surveys are collected and the information tracked to see how our students are going and to pick up and address any problems that they might be facing.

The key focus for the circle time is;

- Check In How are we doing, as a group and as individuals? It is about us checking in with the students to identify any red flags but also teaches our students to be aware of how others may be feeling from week to week. It ingrains empathy and care for others.
- Give students an opportunity to speak about matters that affect them It is important that we have structures in place to allow students to be heard about things that matter to them. We have student feedback forms, but this will be an additional method we can use. It can be little things to discuss about food, activities, their rooms, dorms, staff, other students etc.
- Allows us to listen and respond It is important that we give students a platform to discuss thoughts and ideas and that we listen and act on these requests, as long as they are reasonable. If we show support and act on reasonable requests, the students will be happier and want to let us know when things are not working.
- Give us an opportunity to clarify expectations These discussions will allow us to clarify and explain the reasons why we do things. To continually clarify expectations allows everyone to have a better understanding of what is expected and why. This gives our students a greater chance of meeting the expectations if they can understanding why they are there.




Ten students represented St John's Catholic College at the 77th Anniversary of Indonesian Independence Day on the 17th August.

Our school will be involved in B Part of It NT, a study of the meningococcal B vaccine. The licenced vaccine is safe and proven to protect against meningococcal B disease, a rare but severe disease.

The study nurses will visit schools across Northern Territory in 2022 to offer free Meningococcal B vaccination to students in years 9,10, 11 and 12.

If you child joined the study in 2021, you don't need to sign another consent for them this year.
