Fortes in Fide OUR CATHOLIC **IDENTITY**

St John's Catholic College draws its charism from two religious orders, the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart (MSC) and the Daughters of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart (OLSH). Our spiritual founder, Father Jules Chevalier was a French Catholic priest who was born in Richelieu, France in 1824. Father Chevalier was ordained a priest in 1851 and founded the MSC in 1854 and the OLSH in 1874 in Issoudun, France, He died in 1907, Father Chevalier had a deep devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and believed that the whole of creation is the gift of God's love, and that everything that exists is being sustained and cared for by God's tender compassionate care.

St John's Catholic College was founded in 1960 and is one five MSC founded secondary schools in Australia: Downlands College, Toowoomba, Queensland (1931), Chevalier College, Bowral, New South Wales (1946), Monivae College, Hamilton, Victoria (1954), and Daramalan College, Canberra, Australian Capital Territory (1962).

Saint John the Evangelist is the patron saint of the College. He is also known as John the Apostle and is one of the most prominent figures in the New Testament. He is attributed as the author of the Gospel of John, which is one of the four canonical Gospels in the Bible. John was one of Jesus' closest disciples and is often referred to as 'John the Beloved'.

TEACHING AND LEARNING: YEARS 7-9

Curriculum:

The Year 7 - 9 curriculum is drawn from the Journey in Faith program (Religious Education) and the Australian Curriculum (all other subjects).

Core Subjects:

Year 7 - 9 students study:

- Religious Education
- English
- Mathematics
- Science
- History (one semester) and Geography (one semester).
- *Health and Physical Education
- *Core subject timetabled on an elective line

Targeted Placement:

Core subjects are studied in year levels with classes determined by Targeted Placement, which refers to the grouping of students in classes based on academic levels to better cater for their learning needs. This provides students with the opportunity to receive support and/or extension learning, depending on their progress.

Assessment and Reporting:

SEQTA is the primary mode for communicating academic results. Parents / Carers are expected to regularly monitor their child's academic progress throughout the semester as assessment items are marked.



Electives:

Students in Years 7 - 9 undertake two electives per semester from a range of options, including:

Electives are studied in vertical classes (Years 7 - 9) and are determined by a subject selection process each semester.

Electives are subject to teacher availability and student interest.

Standardised Testing:

St John's participates in the national assessment plan literacy and numeracy (NAPLAN), as well as the ACER's progressive assessment tests to collect data to inform teaching and learning.

Pedagogy:

Teaching and Learning is guided by our School Wide Pedagogy (SWP) and encompasses: high expectations of students, higher order thinking skills and academic rigour. Our SWP includes the following phases: direct instruction, practising and deepening (modelling and scaffolding), application of knowledge and skills (higher order thinking skills and problem-based learning).

CURRICULUM

Religious Education Curriculum:

Based on the South Australian Religious Education Framework, Journey in Faith, is the Religious Education Curriculum for students in Years 7 - 9. Drawing on the sources of our faith; creation, scripture, tradition and human experience, Journey in Faith provides a way of seeing the world, acting in it and of responding to it, all drawn from the simple reality of our faith: God loves us and calls us to life in full abundance. Journey in Faith is constructed around five key learning areas: God, Us and Faith, Sacred Text, Prayer and Sacramentality, Moral Life, and Church for the World. In addition, students undertake units from the Made in the Image of God (MITIOG) human sexuality curriculum.

TEACHING AND LEARNING: YEARS 10-12

Curriculum and Certification:

The Year 10 - 12 curriculum is drawn from the South Australian Certificate of Education Board (with the exception of Year 10 Mathematics which is sourced from the Australian Curriculum). Students in Years 10 - 12 work towards achieving the Northern Territory Certificate of Education and Training (NTCET) and the Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR).

Curriculum Design:

The Northern Territory Certificate of Education and Training, which is derived from the SACE, is a modern, internationally-recognised secondary school qualification designed to equip students with the skills, knowledge, and personal capabilities to successfully participate in our fast-paced global society. In addition to subject specific content and skills, the NTCET is designed to develop personal capabilities within learners: literacy, numeracy, information and communication technology, critical and creative thinking, personal and social, ethical understanding and intercultural understanding.

Subjects Studied:

Students study Religious Education, English, Mathematics, Exploring Identities and Futures (EIF), Stage 1 and Stage 2 subjects during their senior years of study. Every student's pathway through the NTCET is unique.

Vocational Education and Training (VET):

Students are able to undertake a range of external vocational education and training courses from Year 10. Students interested in undertaking a VET course are required to meet with the VET and Careers Coordinator.

Distance Education:

St John's works in partnership with the Northern Territory School of Distance Education and Open Access Centre to provide access to Stage 1 and 2 subjects not on offer at the College. Students demonstrating a high level of academic commitment and independent learning are able to apply to undertake distance education subjects from Year 11.

The NTCFT and Benchmarks:

Students typically undertake the NTCET over three years. The NTCET is based on a credit system whereby students must gain 200 credits in a mix of compulsory and non-compulsory subjects across Stage 1 and Stage 2. The College has benchmarks to support students to achieve the NTCET. Students not meeting the required benchmarks are provided the opportunity to undertake the NTCET over additional years.

Pedagogy:



The Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR):

The Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) is a number between 0.00 and 99.95 that indicates a student's position relative to all the students completing an Australian Year 12 program. Universities use the ATAR to select students for their courses. Admission to most tertiary courses is based on the student's selection rank (student ATAR + any applicable adjustments).

INTENSIVE ENGLISH UNIT

Catholic College John's offers Intensive English Unit (IEU) for International and New students. The IEU caters Beginning, Emerging and Developing English language acquisition, and supports students in the Consolidating transition into mainstream classes. The IEU supports in acquiring proficiency in the producstudents tive and receptive modes of reading/viewing, writing, listening and speaking. IEU classes are multi-age classes. Students study in the IEU from one term up to four semesters depending on proficiency levels and visa conditions. The IEU is staffed by experienced teachers who hold further qualifications in TEFL and/or EALD pedagogies.


BYOD (Bring Your Own Device):

All students in Years 7-12 are provided with access to the Jacaranda Textbook eLibrary (JacPLUS) and the associated online activities (LearnOn). The Jacaranda Textbook eLibrary includes textbooks for all middle school core subjects (except Religious Education) and for selected senior school subjects. PASTORAL CARE AND WELLBEING

Pastoral Care and Wellbeing is at the heart of the educational experience at St John's Catholic College. In creating a culture of welcome and belonging within a small school environment, the pastoral care and wellbeing program is based on faith, education, community and tradition.

Our Pastoral Care Program:

Inspired by Jesus Christ and the model of service leadership, St John's Catholic College provides formal and informal opportunities for students to develop their leadership skills and qualities. 

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

St John's Catholic College is an International Day school and a registered CRICOS Provider (00466K), having a long history educating International Students from around the world. Current International Students come from a range of countries, including: Indonesia, Timor Leste, China, India, Thailand, Philippines, Ghana, Nepal, Bangladesh, Vietnam, Nigeria, Sri Lanka, Malaysia, Japan, Kenya, Brazil and Papa New Guinea. In addition, the College has a multinational and multilingual Faculty supporting our International Students.

The College is an 'English language instruction' school, and supports International Students from a non-English speaking background through our Intensive English Unit.

International Students are supported by the International Coordinator who works with families regarding enrolment, travel, visas, health insurance, education, pastoral care and communication.

The College's international program is regulated and supported by the Australian and Northern Territory Governments and is subject to the National Code and visa conditions as required of International Students in Australian Schools.

International Students are placed in either the Intensive English Unit or mainstream classes. Students undertake an initial placement assessment to determine their level of English language proficiency and assigned class.

Early Bird Discount:

A 5% discount will be given to families off the tuition component for the year if the yearly account is paid in full by Friday 20th February 2026.

Multiple Student Discount:

Domestic families are entitled to a discount off the tuition component (only), if more than one student from the same family attends any Catholic School across the Northern Territory. It is the responsibility of the family to inform the Finance Officer at time of enrolment. The discount will be applied in the following manner to ensure all schools share the cost of the discount:

- · First and eldest child
- Second child
- Third child
- Fourth and subsequent children
- full tuition fee
- 5% off each child's tuition fee
- 10% off each child's tuition fee
- 33% off each child's tuition fee

Financial Hardship Concessions:

Families requesting a financial hardship concession need to contact the Finance Manager and submit an application. Financial hardship concessions are available to families at the discretion of the Principal. Financial hardship concessions are provided for one year, and are reviewed in subsequent years. Documentation is required to support all financial hardship concessions.

Student Withdrawal and Refund:

A term notice in writing must be given to the Finance Officer before a student is withdrawn from the College.
