## **Cross Country (30 August):**


While the CENT RAP launch was occurring, the Annual Cross Country was being run, amid serious athleticism, laughter and cheering.

#### **NAPLAN Trial:**

Our school is commencing preparations to move NAPLAN testing from paper to online. These activities are part of a national program to transition all NAPLAN testing from paper to online testing by 2021. To ensure we will be ready in 2020, our school will be participating in school readiness testing on Thursday 19th September. The school readiness testing is not a test of the students, but will assist the school to prepare for online testing in May 2020.

Students participating in the school readiness testing may sit up to two 40 minute online assessments; a writing test and a combined numeracy/literacy test.
