

The Townsville Grammar School experience is a balanced offering of exceptional education, teamed with an extensive Co-curricular Program, community service and school spirit in a values-based environment.

Across our School, from Prep to Year 12, at all three Campuses, students are offered a variety of opportunities to develop their talents and interests through the Co-curricular Program.

Our Melior Exi (Go out Better) Program is offered to Year 6 students. The program is a unique learning experience that builds self-esteem, confidence and community mindedness through four distinct phases:

- 1. Students learn a new skill in an area that is of interest to themselves.
- 2. Students are involved in servant leadership through a number of community-based activities.
- Students participate in a range of physical challenges that include hiking and abseiling.
- 4. Students deliver a presentation to their peers and parents outlining a new skill they have been attempting to master.

DUKE OF EDINBURGH

The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award is the most recognised and utilised youth development program in Australia.

The aim of the program is to motivate young people to become involved in a balanced program of self-development activities. The Award is conducted at Townsville Grammar School for students in Year 9 and above (aged 14 and over).

The Award is a non-competitive program involving community service and adventure-based activities of a practical and physical nature. These activities provide opportunities for students to acquire and develop skills and initiative and build self-esteem.


