Below is a checklist for all housekeeping tasks we require your support with on Boarders' Travel Day.

Can we please ask that you see to the relevant tasks before departing? Once your child or children are settled you are more than welcome to take them out for the afternoon.

Prior to Arrival	
<input type="checkbox"/>	Ensure all clothing has been clearly labelled
<input type="checkbox"/>	Refer to the packing list to ensure all of the required items for that term's activities have been purchased or left at home
<input type="checkbox"/>	Ensure arriving Boarders have appropriate hair styles, colours and that grooming is of a school standard (Refer to the School Handbook)
<input type="checkbox"/>	Spend time reading through the boarding handbook, routines and expectations
<input type="checkbox"/>	Download the TGS App and set up your Reach Account (refer to Reach information letter)
Boarding Reception	
<input type="checkbox"/>	Collect any Box of Books textbook and School Locker uniform orders that have been delivered for collection (If applicable).
<input type="checkbox"/>	International students to submit their passport for secure storage, in addition to any valuable items or money you wish for Boarding to hold for you child.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Confirm any individual transport arrangements with Mrs Siandri if you have requested this.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Confirm that you have a current copy of the 2026 Boarding Handbook, School Handbook and that your contact information is correct
Boarding Houses	
<input type="checkbox"/>	Introduce yourself to Heads of House – Ms Jenny Cadogan and Mr Andrew McKinnon
<input type="checkbox"/>	Confirm room location, begin to unpack and set up bedroom
<input type="checkbox"/>	Collect padlock for boarders' locker
<input type="checkbox"/>	Ensure all contact details have been saved into boarders' and parents phones.
Health Centre	
<input type="checkbox"/>	Introduce yourself to one of our friendly Nurses; Sr Kaite Gowland, Sr Susan Scott, Sr Sam Jhinku who will guide you through any outstanding medical questions
<input type="checkbox"/>	Deposit all relevant scripts, doctors' notes and medications directly to health centre. Note that no medications are to be stored in the boarding houses. All medications should be clearly labelled in English by a Pharmacist
<input type="checkbox"/>	Provide Medicare card, health insurance information (if applicable), and consent forms for immunisations (Y7 and Y10), setting up a pharmacy account and non-prescription medications

NEW BOARDERS' INDUCTION PROGRAM

To make the transition to boarding as smooth as possible, we have several orientation opportunities during the opening weeks of term for new boarders. These are detailed below under calendar of events, and each provide a unique opportunity to support new students or their families. New boarders will also undergo a thorough induction program during the opening weeks to provide them with the specific supports required to thrive in boarding. A summary is detailed below.

INCOMING TRANSPORT

Please be sure to arrange any transport needs well in advance by contacting TGS Boarding Reception. If you have not yet provided incoming flight itineraries to your Head of House, please do so as a matter of urgency to ensure that transport is arranged for a prompt pick up. It is strongly encouraged that no new boarders arrive without parent or guardians.

There is limited staff only parking on campus, parents may park temporarily to drop off luggage, but must park off campus. Parking is available on Paxton St, with moving trolleys available to assist families in moving in.

MEDICAL INFORMATION

All new boarders must attend the Health centre on travel day or in the week preceding to confirm all medical information with our nursing team. This is regardless of ongoing conditions or medications. Health Centre staff will require consent for several procedures throughout the year.

If your child does have any medical conditions, concerns or recent injuries, this should be raised in advance of your arrival to ensure continuity of care with our boarding team.

Medications must be handed over to nursing staff for safe storage and management. Under no circumstances should controlled, prescription or over the counter medications be stored in

PRE ARRIVAL CHECK INS

I look forward to welcoming you to TGS Boarding as your child commences their exciting journey as boarder at Townsville Grammar School. In the weeks prior to your child's arrival our heads of house will be in touch to arrange a short phone or teams call to get to know each new boarder. This is to assist in their initial rooming and general transition to boarding.
