FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Given that I will be retiring at the end of this year after 20 years at Grammar, it is with mixed emotions that I write a few words in this, my final contribution to Melior Exi.

My feelings are mixed because on the one hand I have genuinely loved my role at Grammar and have always enjoyed my interactions with Past Grammarians — young and not so young! On the other hand, I am also looking forward to beginning the next phase of my life, closer to family in SE Queensland. This year will be my 44th year in schools, as a teacher and educator, since taking my first classes as an Economics and History teacher in Adelaide in 1973.

I have been blessed by my association with a number of special people during my Headship and in this category I acknowledge Judge Stuart Durward, Mr Bill Muller and Mr Jack Callcott. Judge Durward, in his capacity as Chairman of the Board of Trustees, appointed me as Principal and I have been incredibly fortunate to work alongside such a wonderfully measured and supportive Chairman. Bill Muller was the Deputy Headmaster when I arrived in 1998 and in his current role as the School Archivist, he has been an invaluable support person. Jack Callcott [1969] has always been a delight to work with – in terested, supportive, humorous, insightful and loyal to the School. I am deeply indebted to Stuart, Bill and Jack and numerous other very loyal and supportive Trustees, staff and members of the broader community. I would hope to acknowledge a number of other special associates, in due course.

This year marks the 20th anniversary of the Annandale Campus and also the foundation year of the North Shore Primary Campus. Annandale, under the Junior School leadership of **Mr Norm Kerley [1996 - 2006]** and **Mr Noel Nethery [2007 -]**, has grown from strength to strength and is now a campus of nearly 500 children from Pre-Prep to Year 6. Three foundation staff from 1997 still work at Grammar; Mrs Jenny Svane, Mrs Karin Poole and Mrs Cheryl Kybus — who is now the Year 7 Curriculum Co-ordinator at North Ward.

The North Shore Campus has started well, particularly given the difficult economic times in Townsville, and our Pre-Kindy to Year 2 enrolment is nearly 80 students.

North Shore will quickly reach one-stream capacity over the next 4 years. All staff appointed to the North Shore Campus this year have come from Annandale, including the inaugural Head of Campus, Mr Giles Derrett. This has been a deliberate strategy in ensuring that our timeless values are in place from the very beginning of the growth and development of the new campus.

The external restoration of School House is proceeding to plan and it is anticipated that all such works, including the re-instatement of the southern and eastern verandas will be in place by the end of this year. The restored building that is slowly emerging from behind safety fencing is looking absolutely fantastic and will be an enormous heritage asset in years to come. Next year, the focus will turn to the full restoration of the internal spaces of the building, both upstairs and downstairs and I imagine it will not be long before the next Principal will operate from an office inside this magnificent building!

Norm was Dux of the School in 1925 and then returned to teach at the School. He married the daughter of the Headmaster, Mr Rowland, before moving to Sydney in 1934 to teach at Scotch. Knowing the love that Mr Rowland had for Shakespeare it is not surprising that Norm would follow that path.

Two life members continue to show an interest in the Association. MALCOLM SKINNER [1939] who attended the School in the late 1930's, now lives in retirement on the Gold Coast. EDNA SHAW [1938], our Patron, is now a resident in a Care Unit in Melbourne. 
